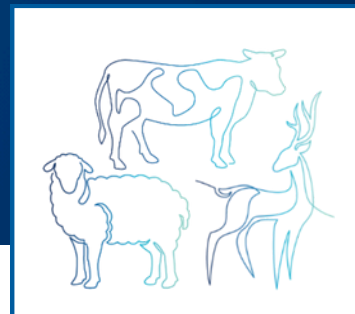


ANIMALS TRACEABILITY



Reference Guide | Livestock Carrier

This reference guide describes the key government requirements regarding animal traceability in Québec. The information in this document does not replace that of the official legislation and is not exhaustive. 1. Registration

What to do?

2. Transportation of a bovine, an ovine or a cervid

What to do?

Time limit

Report the transportation of the animal.

When transporting an animal, you must inform Attestra of the following information:

- Your stakeholder number¹ or name and address
- The premises number² or address of the premises of origin, in addition to the premises number or address of the destination premises
- The number on the tags³ affixed to the animal
- The date of the animal's arrival
- The date of the loading of the animal
- The registration number of the vehicle and, if applicable, the registration number of the trailer or semi-trailer in which the animal was transported
- The names and addresses of the previous and subsequent owners or custodians, or their stakeholder numbers

In the **7 days** following the transportation of the animal.

3. Interdictions

It is forbidden to:

- Remove or cause to remove an animal that is not bearing at least one approved tag from an agricultural operation.
- Transport or cause to transport an animal that is not bearing at least one approved tag.
- Affix the tags to an animal in a vehicle. The identification of an animal must be done in an agricultural operation.
- Remove or cause to remove tags from an animal.

¹ The stakeholder number is a number that was attributed by Attestra (ex. TRA12345).

² The premises number is a number that was attributed by Attestra to a location where animals are being held (ex. QC1234567).

³ The approved tags carry a unique and ISO compliant 15-digit number corresponding to a specific specie. These tags have been approved by the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA) according to the Part XV of the [Health of Animals Regulations](#).
